### April 20 — Encountering Whiteness: Developing a New Pro-Reconciling Identity

The first session of this series will focus on Identity Development in the local church. We will ask ourselves what it means to be an anti-racist church. Rev. Dr. Johnson will call the church to ask what assets we

bring to the reconciliation movement. This session will introduce the church to the meaning of Whiteness and how the church can build a new identity as a Pro-Reconciling Congregation.



# **April 27** — Understanding Whiteness: Centering Anti-Racism in Predominantly White Spaces

Christianity is not immune to the problem of Whiteness. In today's church, it takes intentional work to be grounded in Gospel, rather than Whiteness. What is needed to help the local church, particularly the white local church, challenge Whiteness? How

do we begin conversations in predominantly white local churches? What tools, spiritual practices, and resources are needed? This session will explore Whiteness in the particular context of the local church and what particular responses are needed.
